Plane talk It's been more than a decade since wordsmith-conceptualist Jenny Holzer last presented a public artwork in NYC. But thanks to Creative Time, the artist returns to the great outdoors on Saturday 30, Sunday 31 and Monday 1—weather permitting—as a squadron of airplanes flies above the Hudson River, toting texts from her renowned "Truisms" series, such as ABUSE OF POWER COMES AS NO SURPRISE (pictured) and WHAT YOU FEAR OVERTAKES YOU (she's thrown in a few quotes from the likes of Abe Lincoln for good measure).
