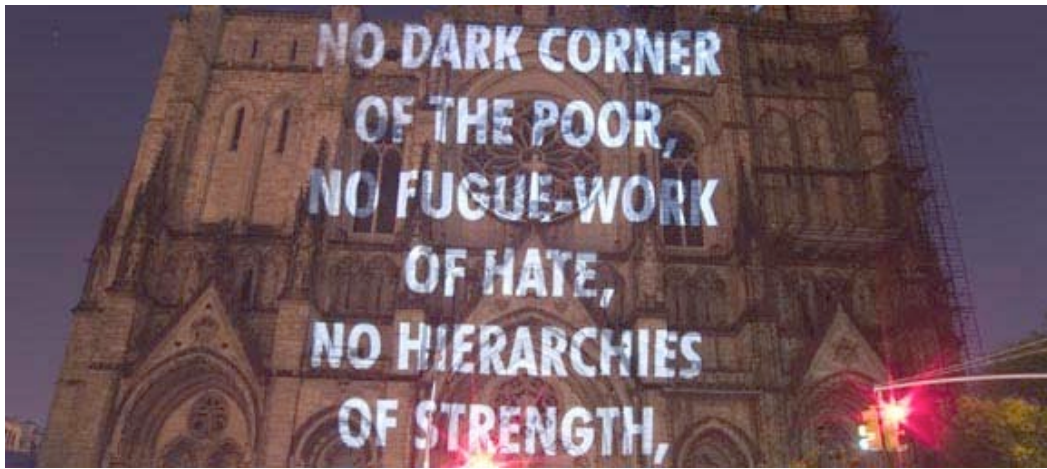

JENNY HOLZER: *FOR NEW YORK CITY*

Jenny Holzer returns to New York City to launch her first public artwork here in over a decade. The project consists of her first xenon projections in the United States, and an inventive and spectacular display of her Truisms flying high in the New York City sky.

XENON POETRY PROJECTIONS **8PM - MIDNIGHT**

Since 1996, Jenny Holzer has used xenon projectors to cast text onto buildings, mountains, rivers and assorted public sites in Europe, Mexico and South America. She now presents them for the first time in the United States. A powerful beam of light creates a procession of text and the writing is in constant motion as it cascades down the chosen location. The words of important poets William Carlos Williams, Walt Whitman, Langston Hughes, Yehuda Amichai, Henri Cole, Wislawa Szymborska, and others will scroll over landmark New York City sites enveloping them with beauty and power.

AIRPLANE BANNERS

Saturday October 30, Sunday October 31 and Monday November 1

A squadron of airplanes will fly along the Hudson River pulling banners emblazoned with text comprised of Truisms and a quote from Abraham Lincoln. Filling the sky with universal declarations, the artwork will enthrall onlookers to reflect upon the manifestations of power, public life, and the role of the individual in collective society.

Planes fly from Verrazano Bridge up the Hudson River to the George Washington Bridge, looping from Battery Park City. Best viewing along the Hudson waterfront from New York and New Jersey. For more than twenty-five years, Jenny Holzer has presented her astringent ideas, arguments, and sorrows in public places and international exhibitions, including the Venice Biennale, the Reichstag, and the Guggenheim Museums in New York and Bilbao. Her medium, whether formulated as a t-shirt, as a plaque, or as an LED sign, always is writing, and the public dimension is integral to the delivery of her work. Starting in the late 1970s with the posters that Holzer pasted on buildings in New York City, and up to her recent xenon projections on landscape and architecture, her practice has rivaled ignorance and violence with humor, kindness, and moral courage. Holzer lives in Hoosick, New York.
