
Street closure plan in the Lower Ninth by Gavin Kroeber, 2007




Drawing for staging Gentilly Godot by Gavin Kroeber, 2007, pen and pencil on paper





# BRINGING THE CORNER BACK TO LIFE

(The Times-Picayune, October 29, 2007)

What did Paul Chan see when he toured New Orleans during the summer of 2006?

"The empty corners reminded me of every production of *Waiting for Godot* I had ever seen: the silence, the trees, the empty roads."

Samuel Beckett, the author of this modern theater classic, is an unlikely playwright to tell the tale of New Orleans. His is a stark, brooding, and somewhat cold sensibility. His aesthetic is to the modern stage what black-and-white is to modern television.

New Orleans, of course, is a city of brilliant colors.

But Chan's eyes didn't deceive him. The New York-based artist saw that our wounded spirit and empty neighborhoods were a perfect backdrop for Beckett's wounded characters and empty hopes.

"I realized that I had to do more than visit for a couple of days. I had to take the opportunity to realize the hallucination I had seen on the street, and to do it in a way that would be locally sustainable.

"Within my world, contemporary art, there are many shows that go in and out of different locations. The art comes and it leaves. I realized that if I was going to do something in New Orleans, it had to be different."

### Evolution of art

Chan is an internationally renowned artist and activist. He divides his time between protesting the war in Iraq and creating video shorts, digital projections, and charcoal drawings.

For him, simply staging an outdoor performance on a desolate corner was not enough. He polled the community, asking, "If I were to stage a free, outdoor performance of Samuel Beckett's *Waiting for Godot*, what else would you like to see happen?"

"It was through all these conversations that we began to evolve this project from a free outdoor performance into a multidimensional project that is as diverse as the city itself."

### Promoting a belief


So Chan gives free, open-to-the-public lectures on contemporary art at the University of New Orleans and Xavier University. He attends potluck dinners at the homes of prominent and not-so-prominent New Orleanians.

He has joined forces with the Classical Theatre of Harlem and actor Wendell Pierce, a New Orleans native, to bring Beckett's play to our streets this weekend.

The work of an Irish playwright who died nearly twenty years ago would seem an unlikely choice for the illumination of the conditions in contemporary New Orleans. But for Chan, understanding humanity requires the cross-cultural, the unexpected, and the complex.

"The worst thing in the world is to reduce what it means to be a human being," Chan says. "To me it means being as complex as possible."
