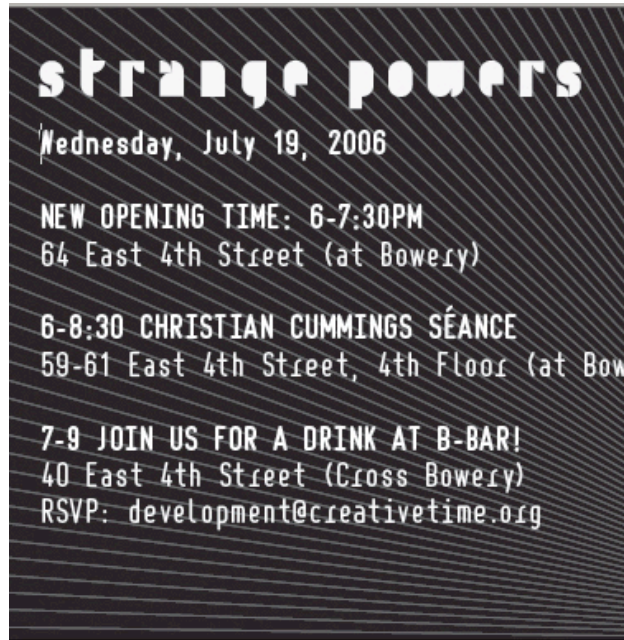

### A Virtual Sojourn



Tamiko Thiel's 'The Travels of Mariko Horo' is truly a

multimedia project. The whole thing revolves around a travel narrative centered on a character appropriately named Mariko the Wanderer. Mysteriously hailing from a period somewhere in the mammoth range of the 12th to the 22nd centuries, Mariko's journey involves moving West from Japan, in search of a Buddhist paradise. Her successful quest is marked by the additional discovery of a dark purgatorial space. All of the character's memories--both visual and textual--are rendered in 'The Travels of Mariko.' Users become the lead character, seeing the world through her eyes as a joystick steers them through this fictional space. The actual project is doing a bit of touring, premiering at this week's ISEA festival, in San Jose,
